

ANTI-BULLYING PLAN 2024

ASHCROFT PUBLIC SCHOOL

Bullying behaviour has three key features. It involves the intentional misuse of power in a relationship. It is ongoing and repeated, and it involves behaviours that can cause harm. The NSW Department of Education requires all NSW public schools to have an Anti-bullying Plan which details the strategies implemented to reduce student bullying behaviours.

Ashcroft Public School's commitment

Our school rejects all forms of bullying behaviours, including online (or cyber) bullying by maintaining a commitment to providing a safe, inclusive and respectful learning community that promotes student wellbeing. Executive staff are committed to establishing evidence-based approaches and strategies that promote a positive climate where bullying is less likely to occur.

1. School culture and inclusion

All members of the school community are active participants in building a welcoming school culture thatvalues diversity and fosters positive relationships. A key component of a supportive school culture is building respectful relationships and an ethos that bullying is not accepted, in both online and offline environments. School staff will actively respond to student bullying behaviour.

Our school engages in the following practices to promote a positive school culture.

1.1 Student assemblies

Student bullying and expectations about student behaviour will be discussed and information presented to promote a positive school culture where bullying is not accepted.

Term 1 1 and 5 February 2024	Student Behaviour Code
Term 1 - 4 Weeks 2 - 9	Students will participate in explicit lessons that reflect the schools Learner Qualities regularly throughout the year in class. The schools Learner Qualities are Care, Collaboration, Resilience, Choice and Critical Thinking.
Term 1 - 4: Wednesday Weeks 4, 7, 10	Expectations of Learner Qualities and student behaviour are discussed at student assemblies throughout the year.
Term 1 - 4: Thursday Weeks 1 - 10	Weekly conversations and reminders aligned to explicit lessons which teach social skills throughout the year.
Term 1 21 March 2024	Harmony Day – Celebration of harmony and inclusion
Term 4 18 November 2024	White Ribbon Day – Celebration of respectful relationships

1.2 Staff communication and professional learning

Staff will be supported with professional learning that provides evidence-based ways to encourage and teach positive social and emotional wellbeing and discourage, prevent, identify, and respond effectively to student bullying behaviour.

DATES	COMMUNICATION TOPICS & PROFESSIONAL LEARNING
Term 1 - 4: Tuesday Weeks 1 - 10	At every communication meeting staff discuss student behaviour data and ensure we identify any negative behaviour which is addressed on an individual basis.
Term 1 Weeks 1 - 5	Review of Staff Behaviour Policy Professional Learning addressing APS Behaviour for Success Learner Qualities using school developed Social Emotional continuums and positive, proactive strategies.
Term 1 - 4 Weeks 1 - 10	Support staff to design individualised support plans and/or programs for students.
Term 1 - 4 Weeks 1 - 10	Whole School Professional Learning on trauma informed practice and Berry Street Training.

1.3 New and casual staff

New and casual staff will be informed about our school's approaches and strategies to prevent and respond to student bullying behaviour in the following ways.

During the induction process, new staff will receive the schools Wellbeing Policy outlining process, programs and procedures implemented to prevent, identify and manage student behaviour.

- information is provided in a handout to staff when they enter on duty at the school
- an executive staff member speaks to new and casual staff when they enter on duty at the school
- the principal speaks to new executive staff when they enter on duty at the school, as part of the induction process.

Partnerships with families and community

Effective schools have high levels of parental and community involvement. This involvement is strongly related to improved student learning, attendance and behaviour. Our school proactively builds collaborative relationships with families and communities to create a shared understanding of how to support student learning, safety and wellbeing.

2.1 Website

Our school website has information to support families help their children to regulate their emotions and behaviour and develop socially. Information is provided to assist if children have been involved in bullying behaviour (as the person engaging in bullying behaviour, as the person being bullied or as the person witnessing the bullying behaviour).

Term 4	Transition meetings, information sessions and transition packs for Preschool, Kindergarten and High School.

3. Support for wellbeing and positive behaviours

Our school's practices support student wellbeing and positive behaviour approaches that align with our school community's needs.

Social and emotional skills related to personal safety, resilience, help-seeking and protective behaviours are explicitly taught across the curriculum in Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE).
